He writes: I see that August 19th is logged for a visit to the upper bay. We're located at Georgetown Yacht Basin, a really nice marina base on located on the Sassafra River (Skipjack Cove, Sailing Associates, Sassafra Harbour and Georgetown Yacht Basin). Now, I know that August is a dreadful month to cruise anywhere on the bay due to heat so I wanted to find out who would be interested in 'cruising' north to

hang around in Georgetown for a weekend. Thinking out of the box here for a moment, what would you think of a friendly CMA cruise race from Annapolis to Georgetown Yacht Basin? Annual Trophy for line honors and corrected time? Once you arrive, there is a nice pool, nice showers, a BBQ area and a couple of really nice restaurants with outdoor dining to enjoy. I think bands still play on Saturday evenings in August. And if you are really interested in a romantic getaway, there is the Kitty Knight House Bed and Breakfast. I have been looking into a America's Cup in Valencia trip for the Club. I have found one through Cruising World magazine and King Yacht Charters. A one week bareboat charter and seven days on land for the Louis Vuitton Cup, May 3-18, 2007 including airfare from NYC costs \$4,800 per person. A land only one week on sailing trip costs \$3,400. A one week bareboat charter and seven days on land, including airfare for the America's Cup, June 14-29, 2007, costs \$4,975 per person. The one week land only visit would be \$3,700.
